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ANNUAL STATEMENT OF REVENUE POLICY

The following rating proposals for 2009/10 Ordinary and Special Rates are based on a rate pegging limit of 3.5%, as determined by the Minister of Local Government, applied to the 2008/09 notional yield and calculated in accordance with the Local Government Act 1993.

In accordance with Section 404 of the Local Government Act 1993 Council provides the following details of Council's revenue policy.

1 STATEMENT OF RATES PROPOSED TO BE LEVIED

For 2009/10 Council will be using the latest valuations from the Valuer General's Department for the calculation of Ordinary Rates and Special Rates. These valuations have a base date of 1 July 2008, as a general re-valuation of land was undertaken in Wyong Shire for the 2009/10 rating year. Revaluations generally occur every three years for local government rating purposes.

Each council that is revalued is advised of the latest values of properties and the landowner is advised with a Notice of Valuation issued by the Valuer General. Each Notice of Valuation contains both details of the property as they are recorded on the Valuer General's records and the land value. The valuations are objective and impartial, and are based on the market for land.

Changes in relative land value can affect the amount of rates to be paid by landowners. For example, those land owners whose land values increase by more than the Shire average will pay increased rates while those land owners whose values have increased less than the Shire average will pay decreased rates. This is due to the ad valorem rating method whereby the incidence of any rate burden is split differentially according to land value of rateable property.

Section 497 of the Local Government Act 1993 provides the following methods of structuring the Ordinary Rates.

- An ad valorem;
- A base amount plus an ad valorem; or
- An ad valorem with a minimum rate

In determining its proposed rating structure for 2000/01 Council considered a number of rating options and decided on a rating method of a base amount plus an ad valorem (land value multiplied by a rate in \$) for each of the following categories. It is proposed that this rating structure continue for 2009/10.

In determining the base amount of \$154.00 Council had regard to the requirements of Section 536 of the Local Government Act.

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Land Categories

Categorisation of all rateable land in the Shire as at 1 January 1994 took place with the issue of the rate notice in January 1994, in accordance with the requirements of Chapter 15 of the Local Government Act 1993. New parcels of land created since that date have been categorised with the issue of subsequent rate notices.

Farmland: (Section 515 Local Government Act 1993)

Land is categorised as farmland if it is a parcel of rateable land valued as one assessment and its dominant use is for farming or agricultural production. Rural residential land is not categorised farmland.

Residential: (Section 516 Local Government Act 1993)

Land is categorised as residential if it is a parcel of rateable land valued as one assessment and its dominant use is for residential accommodation or rural residential land or if it is vacant land it is zoned or otherwise designated for use under an environmental planning instrument for residential purposes.

Mining: (Section 517 Local Government Act 1993)

Land is to be categorised mining if it is a parcel of rateable land valued as one assessment and its dominant use is for a coal mine or metalliferous mine.

Business: (Section 518 Local Government Act 1993)

Land is to be categorised as business if it cannot be categorised as farmland, residential or mining. Caravan parks and manufactured home communities are to be categorised business.

Pension Rebates - Ordinary Rates

In accordance with Section 575 of the Local Government Act 1993 Council provides a rate reduction of 50% of the amount of the ordinary rate levy together with the domestic waste management charge up to a maximum reduction of \$250 to eligible pensioners. Of this rate reduction 55% is reimbursed by the NSW Government.

The estimated total amount of the pension rebate in 2009/10 is \$2,441,000.

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Interest on Overdue Ordinary Rates & Charges – Local Government Act 1993

In accordance with Section 566 of the Local Government Act 1993 Council charges interest on all rates and charges which remain unpaid after they become due and payable. The due dates for payment of rates and charges are as follows:

- a If payment is made in a single instalment, the instalment is payable by 31 August 2009.
- b If payment is made by quarterly instalments, the instalments are payable by 31 August 2009, 30 November 2009, 28 February 2010, and 31 May 2010.

Interest will be calculated on a daily basis using the simple interest method. The rate of interest applied to overdue rates and charges levied under the Local Government Act 1993 will be the maximum rate of 9% as specified by the Minister for Local Government and published in the Government Gazette.

Special Rate - The Entrance Town Centre

Following approval by the Minister for Local Government & Co-operatives, Council introduced a special rate levy under Section 495 of Local Government Act as from 1 July 1997. The purpose of this levy was to cover business related costs of The Entrance Town Centre by way of a special rate levied on property owners identified as receiving a benefit from The Entrance Town Centre.

The Special Rate applies to the following properties:

- All land used for business purposes and categorised as such in accordance with Section 518 of the Local Government Act 1993 in the suburb known as The Entrance.
- All land used as Major Facilities servicing tourists including Service Stations, Camp or Caravan Sites, Registered Clubs, Tourist Accommodation and Hotels/Motels as defined in Council's current Local Environmental Plan (LEP) and District Shopping Centres as defined in Council's current Retail Strategy in the suburbs known as The Entrance North, The Entrance, Blue Bay, Long Jetty, Toowoan Bay, Shelly Beach, Bateau Bay and Magenta.
- All land used as rental accommodation and which is categorised as Residential under Section 516 of the Local Government Act, 1993, which is rented or leased for periods of three months or less in the suburbs known as The Entrance North, The Entrance, Blue Bay and Toowoan Bay.

The special rate will be levied by way of a Base Amount plus an Ad Valorem amount. A review of the special rate has been conducted and Council is proposing no change to the structure of the rate and is satisfied that the appropriate properties will be levied with the rate. Details of the rate are as follows:

The percentage of the total amount payable by the levying of the Special Rate - The Entrance Town Centre that the levying of the Base Amount will produce, is 13.41% of the total amount payable.

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Special Rate - Non Residential Properties Toukley Area

Following a request from the Toukley Chamber of Commerce and subsequent approval by the Minister for Local Government and Co-operatives, Council introduced a special rate levy under Section 495 of the Local Government Act as from 1 July 1997 on all properties categorised as Business in the Toukley/Canton Beach/Noraville/Norah Head areas. These are properties that have been identified by Council as receiving a benefit from the business related costs of Greater Toukley Vision such as administration, marketing and promotional activities in the Toukley/Canton Beach/Noraville/Norah Head retail and commercial areas.

The special rate will be levied by way of a Base Amount plus an Ad Valorem amount, as follows:

The percentage of the total amount payable by the levying of the Special Rate - Non Residential Properties Toukley Area, that the levying of the Base Amount will produce, is 10.24% of the total amount payable.

Special Rate - Non Residential Properties Wyong Area

Following a request from the Wyong Tuggerah Chamber of Commerce and subsequent approval by the Minister for Local Government and Co-operatives, Council introduced a special levy under Section 495 of the Local Government Act as from 1 July 2005 on;

- all properties categorised as "Business" in the suburb known as Watanobbi.
- all properties categorised as "Business" in the suburb known as Wyong bounded by the following;
 - North of the Wyong River from Tacoma in the east to the F3 Freeway in the west;
 - East of the F3 Freeway from the Wyong River to the suburb boundary between Wyong and Warnervale but to exclude Lot 32 DP 814964;
 - South of the northern Wyong boundary to its intersection with the Pacific Highway and then south of the Pacific Highway to the intersection of Pollock Avenue, but to include Lot 400 DP 1114793, Lot 1 DP 411020, Lot 3 DP 607756 and Lot 1 DP 1090455 (these lots being to the north of the Pacific Highway; and
 - The eastern boundary of the suburb of Wyong from Johns Road to Wyong River.

These are properties that have been identified by Council as receiving a benefit from the business related costs of the Wyong-Tuggerah Chamber of Commerce such as administration, marketing and promotional activities in the Wyong and Watanobbi retail and commercial areas.

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The special rate will be levied by way of a Base Amount plus an Ad Valorem amount, as follows:

The percentage of the total amount payable by the levying of the Special Rate - Non Residential Properties Wyong Area, that the levying of the Base Amount will produce, is 18.09% of the total amount payable.

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Waterways Environmental Levy

The State Government during 2005/06, approved the provision of a new funding mechanism to improve the management of urban stormwater in NSW. The Local Government Amendment (Stormwater) Act 2005 amended the Local Government Act 1993 to allow councils the option to make a charge for the provision of stormwater management services outside their capped rate arrangements.

In accordance with the Local Government Amendment (Stormwater) Act (under Section 496(a) of the Local Government Act) Council introduced a Stormwater Levy Charge in 2006/07 to provide funds towards the implementation of the Tuggerah Lakes Estuary Management Plan, as well as undertake works on the Shire's other waterways. The stormwater management works have been developed in reference to the objectives of the Hunter Central Rivers Catchment Management Authority's Draft Catchment Action Plan.

Council, in partnership with the State Government, has been studying and planning ways to maintain, improve and protect our lakes and waterways. The Shire's waterways are an integral part of our community's lifestyle and are the focus of many recreational activities including fishing, boating, cycling, walking and picnicking. Their long-term protection will ensure that they are there for current and future generations to enjoy.

Previously identified as a Stormwater Levy, so as to better reflect its purpose, this charge will now be identified as the Waterways Environmental Levy and will apply to the urban area of the Shire – defined as the area to the east of the F3 Freeway plus the Highway Service Centre and any industrial-zoned land to the west of the Freeway. Vacant properties (i.e. those without impervious surfaces) are not subject to this levy.

The annual charging structure has been developed in accordance with the Stormwater Management Service Charge Guidelines issued by the Director General of the Department of Local Government and is as follows:

Residential Properties	\$25.00 per property
Residential Strata Properties	\$12.50 per lot
Residential Company Title Properties	\$25.00 per Company Title complex apportioned according to the number of shares in the company owned by each shareholder
Business Properties	\$25.00 per 850 square metres (or part thereof) with a ceiling of \$5,000
Business Strata Properties	\$25.00 per 850 square metres (or part thereof) of the land area of the strata complex for strata business properties and apportioned equally to each lot within the strata complex
Business Company Title Properties	\$25.00 per 850 square metres (or part thereof) of the Company Title complex with a ceiling of \$5,000, apportioned according to the number of shares in the company owned by each shareholder

The yield from these charges in 2009/10 is estimated to be \$1,713,000.

A contribution from the surpluses from Council's Holiday Park operations, together with Federal Government grant funding, will provide the balance of the funds required to implement the Estuary Management Plan and other works on the Shire's waterways.

Council can only spend the Waterways Environmental Levy on specific works relating to the management of stormwater, and not on its other areas of responsibility.

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The works to be funded from the Waterways Environmental Levy and other funding sources are detailed in the table below:-

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2 STATEMENT OF CHARGES

In accordance with Section 501(1) of the Local Government Act 1993 Council may make and levy an annual charge for the following services:

- Water supply services
- Sewerage services
- Drainage services
- Waste management services (other than domestic waste management services)
- Any services prescribed by the regulations.

2.1 Water Supply, Sewerage Service and Drainage Charges

Wyong Shire Council is constituted as a Water Supply Authority under the Water Management Act 2000 and charges for water , drainage and sewer are levied under this Act.

Being a Water Authority all of Council's water, drainage and sewerage charges are subject to approval by the Minister for Water following determination by the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART).

Water, drainage and sewerage charges for 2009/10 are as per IPART's Water – Determination and Final Report - May 2009.

Pension Rebates - Water and Sewerage Service Charges

In accordance with Part 8, Division 5 of the Water Management (Water Supply Authorities) Regulation 2004 Council provides a reduction of 50% of the water service charges levied up to a maximum of \$87.50 and a further reduction of 50% of sewerage service charges levied up to a maximum of \$87.50. Of these reductions 55% is reimbursed by the New South Wales Government.

The estimated total amount of the pension rebate in 2009/10 is \$2,481,000.

Revenue Policy

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WATER CHARGES (In accordance with IPART Determination)

The proposed charges for water supply are as follows:

The above charges incorporate the State Government's "Climate Change Fund", contribution of \$15.78 per property (subject to gazettal).

Charges for meters not specified above are calculated using the formula: $(\text{Meter Size})^2 \times \$101.68 / 400 + \$15.78$.

The total yield in 2009/10 from this charge is estimated to be \$6,757,000.

Water Usage Charge

All water consumed is proposed to be charged at the rate of 178.0 cents per kilolitre.

It is Council's policy not to levy a charge for accounts of \$5.00 or less.

The total yield in 2009/10 from this charge is estimated to be \$20,749,000.

Water Service Charges Strata Title Properties

It is proposed that where water usage to a residential strata titled property is measured through a common meter, each individual strata title lot be levied a service charge of \$117.46 (Inclusive of the Climate Change Levy of \$15.78). Water usage is to be apportioned and charged to the various lots in the strata plan in accordance with the schedule of unit entitlement and charges to the strata title owners at the rate of 178.0 cents per kilolitre.

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Water Service Charges Retirement Villages

It is proposed that where water usage to a retirement village is measured through a common meter only, the service charge is to be commensurate with the size of the meter. Usage consumed through the common meter is to be charged at the rate of 178.0 cents per kilolitre.

Water Service Charges Community Development Lot

It is proposed that where water usage to a community development lot is measured through a common meter only, the service charge is to be commensurate with the size of the meter and this charge is apportioned to the various lots in the community development lot in accordance with the schedule of unit entitlement. Usage consumed through the common meter is to be apportioned and charged to the individual unit owners in accordance with the unit entitlement at the rate of 178.0 cents per kilolitre.

The total yield in 2009/10 from Strata Title Properties, Retirement Villages, and Community Development Lot charges is estimated to be \$875,000.

Water Service Charges Company Title Dwelling

It is proposed that where water usage to a company title dwelling is measured through a common meter only, each individual company title dwelling be levied a service charge of \$117.46 (Inclusive of the Climate Change Levy of \$15.78). Water usage is to be charged to the owner of the company title building (within the company title dwelling) at the rate of 178.0 cents per kilolitre.

Water Service Charges Vacant Land

It is proposed that a water service charge be levied on vacant land which is not connected to the water supply system but is reasonably available for connection to the water supply system at the rate of \$117.46 (Inclusive of the Climate Change Levy of \$15.78).

Total yield in 2009/10 from this charge is estimated to be \$282,000.

Nominal Service Size

Where water pressure requires larger sizes of pipes and meters a charge as assessed by Council will apply.

Water Fire Service

There is no charge for a separate Water Fire Service. Where a property has a combined fire and commercial service the property will be charged a Water Service Charge – Metered Service commensurate with the meter size.

Part Year Charges and Fees

For those properties that become chargeable or non-chargeable during the year a proportional charge or fee calculated on a weekly basis is applied.

Revenue Policy

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SEWERAGE SERVICE CHARGES (In accordance with IPART Determination)

Residential Charges

Single Residential Properties Including Residential Strata Properties and Company Title Dwellings

It is proposed to continue the current charging structure based on a service charge for each residential property. The proposed charge is \$429.11 for each single residential property/lot/dwelling. There is no usage charge for this category.

The total yield in 2009/10 from this charge is estimated to be \$24,799,000.

Metered Non-Residential Charges

In the determination of Council's 1995/96 charges, the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal approved the introduction of a pay for use system of charging for sewerage based upon a service charge and a usage charge.

Non-Residential customers are those that do not meet the classification as a single residential customer. These include non strata titled residential units and Retirement Villages.

In line with this approval it is proposed to continue with this charging structure, as detailed below:

The maximum price for sewerage services to a non-residential property connected to the sewerage system is the greater of:

- The non-residential minimum sewerage charge; or
- The sum of the non-residential sewerage service charge commensurate with meter size and the non-residential sewerage usage charge.

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A discharge factor is applied to the charge based on the volume of water discharged into Council's sewerage system.

Charges for meters not specified above are calculated using the formula: $(\text{Meter Size})^2 \times \$154.59 / 400 \times \text{discharge factor}$.

Non-Residential Properties - Usage Charge

The price for sewerage usage charges is proposed to be 77.00 cents per kilolitre.

The usage charge is to be based on the estimated volume of metered water usage discharged into the Council's sewerage system. Metered water usage is to be multiplied by a discharge factor, based on the type of premises to estimate the volume of water discharged.

Non-Residential Properties - Minimum Charge

The proposed minimum amount payable for a non-residential customer is \$429.11.

Non-Residential Properties - Community Development Lots

The proposed sewerage service charge for a community development lot is calculated by: the non-residential sewerage usage charge commensurate with meter size apportioned to the various lots in the community development lot in accordance with the schedule of unit entitlement.

The total yield in 2009/10 from these non-residential charges is estimated to be \$708,000 for service charges and \$773,000 for usage charges.

Nominal Service Size

Where water pressure requires larger sizes of pipes and meters a charge as assessed by Council will apply.

Sewerage Service Fees – Exempt Properties

For all properties exempt from service charges under Schedule 4 of the Water Management Act 2000 it is proposed that a fee be charged, in accordance with Section 310(2) of the Act, of \$60.58 per annum for each water closet and \$21.45 per annum for each cistern servicing a urinal where installed.

The total yield in 2009/10 from this fee is estimated to be \$243,000.

Sewerage Service Charges – Vacant Land

It is proposed that the charge for sewerage services on vacant land which is not connected to the sewerage system but is reasonably available for connection to the sewerage system is \$321.84.

The total yield in 2009/10 from this fee is estimated to be \$624,000.

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DRAINAGE SERVICE CHARGES (In accordance with IPART Determination)

In its Determination of Council's 2009/10 charges, the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal approved the introduction of a drainage service charge.

Residential Charges

Single Metered Residential Properties

The proposed charge is \$83.12 for each single residential property/lot/dwelling. There is no usage charge for this category.

The total yield in 2009/10 from this charge is estimated to be \$4,205,000.

Metered Non-Residential Properties

Non-Residential Properties are those that do not meet the definition of Residential Properties or Multi Premises Properties.

It is proposed to use the charging structure detailed below for Non-Residential Properties that are serviced by a water meter:

Charges for meters not specified above are calculated using the formula: $(\text{Meter size})^2 \times \$83.12 / 400$.

The yield from these charges in 2009/10 is estimated to be \$1,133,000.

Nominal Service Size

Where water pressure requires larger sizes of pipes and meters a charge as assessed by Council will apply.

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Multi Premises Properties

The proposed charge is \$62.34 for each Multi Premises property that is serviced by a common water meter or multiple common water meters.

Multi Premises properties include;

- a) Strata Title lots
- b) Company Title dwellings
- c) Community Development lots
- d) Retirement Village units and
- e) a part of a building lawfully occupied or available for occupation (other than those described in paragraphs a) to d) above.

Multi Premises properties do not include hotels, motels, guest houses or backpackers hostels.

The yield from these charges in 2009/10 is estimated to be \$309,000.

LIQUID TRADE WASTE CHARGES

A summary of the trade waste policy outlining the property classifications and charges is as follows:

Premises are classified into the following classifications:

| Classification A | is for low risk liquid trade waste. Is of low volume and/or strength and has standard non-complex pre-treatment requirements. |
| Classification B | is for medium risk liquid trade waste (<20kL per day) with prescribed pre-treatment requirements. |
| Classification C | is for high risk and large liquid trade waste dischargers which are not nominated as a Classification A or B discharger and/or involve a discharge volume of over 20 kL/day. |
| Classification S | is for acceptance of septic tank waste, pan waste and ship-to shore pump-outs into Council's sewerage system. Private pumping stations are also included in Category S. |

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Categories for liquid trade waste pricing:

Pricing for Liquid Trade Waste discharges from the above classifications (excluding Classification S) is calculated based on the following three categories.

Category 1 Liquid Trade Waste Dischargers are those conducting an activity deemed by Council as requiring nil or minimal pre-treatment equipment and whose effluent is well defined and or relatively low risk to the sewerage system. The volume discharge to sewer is deemed to be low. Also included are Classification A or B activities with prescribed pre-treatment but low impact on the sewerage system.

Category 2 Liquid Trade Waste Dischargers are those conducting an activity deemed by Council as requiring a prescribed type of liquid trade waste pre-treatment equipment and whose effluent is well characterised. The volume discharged to sewer may be approved up to 20KL/day.

Category 3 Liquid Trade Waste Dischargers are those conducting an activity which is of an industrial nature and/or which results in the discharge of large volumes (generally over 20kL/day) of liquid trade waste to the sewerage system. Any Category 1 or 2 discharger whose volume exceeds 20 kL/day becomes a Category 3 discharger.

Category S Liquid Trade Waste Discharges are those conducting an activity of transporting and/or discharging septic tank waste, pan waste and ship to shore pump-outs into the sewerage system. Private pumping stations are included in Category S, however the septic waste Disposal charge does not apply.

2.2 Interest on Overdue Water, Sewerage and Drainage Charges

In accordance with Section 356 of the Water Management Act 2000, Council charges interest on all water supply, drainage and sewerage service charges which remain unpaid after they become due and payable. The due dates for payment of water supply, drainage and sewerage service charges are as follows:

- If payment is made in a single instalment, the instalment is payable by 31 August 2009.
- If payment is made by quarterly instalments, the instalments are payable by 31 August 2009, 30 November 2009, 28 February 2010 and 31 May 2010.
- For water consumption charges, the account is due 30 days after posting date.

Interest will be calculated on a daily basis using the simple interest method. The rate of interest will be the rate of interest payable for the time being on an unpaid judgement of the Supreme Court. The rate of interest is currently 9%.

2.3 Developer Contributions

Developer contributions for Water and Sewerage services are levied in accordance with the methodology developed by the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART).

The various contributions are contained in Council's Development Servicing Plans (DSPs) which are available for inspection at Council's Offices.

Other Developer Contributions are levied in accordance with Section 94 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act. The various contribution rates are listed in the section 94 plans available for inspection at Council's offices.

3 STATEMENT OF THE AMOUNTS OF RATES PROPOSED TO BE CHARGED FOR THE CARRYING OUT BY THE COUNCIL OF WORK ON PRIVATE LAND

In accordance with Section 67(1) of the Local Government Act 1993 Council may by agreement with the owner or occupier of any private land carry out on the land any kind of work that may lawfully be carried out on the land.

The rates proposed to be adopted by Council are set to recover the estimated cost to Council in providing the works on private land. The amounts proposed to be charged for private works are set out in the attached Schedule of Fees in accordance with the type of works conducted by Council as indicated below:

For all other works a minimum charge for the use of Council labour, plant or materials on private land equal to the actual cost (including overheads) plus 10%.

The General Manager has the authority to set the fee for works to be undertaken by Council on private land, using Council labour, plant or materials, having regard to market forces in each instance, on condition that no such charge shall be less than the actual cost to Council (including overheads) plus 10%.

4 STATEMENT OF PROPOSED BORROWINGS

It is Council's policy to only borrow to fund capital projects that have a life expectancy beyond the term for repayment of the loan. All loans are secured over the income of the Council.

It is also Council's policy to invite quotes for the provision of loan funds from lending institutions and the most competitive quotation is accepted. The following loan borrowings are proposed for 2009/10:

The fees shown in the Schedule of Fees are arrived at after allowing for normal inflationary growth in the cost of providing these services. However, where the fee is based on the costs of providing the service and those costs increased extraordinarily during the year, Council reserves the right to amend the fees to recover the cost increase.
